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My basement floor drain is backing up when I do laundry - is this serious?

Yes, this is a serious plumbing issue that needs immediate attention. A floor drain backing up during laundry indicates your drainage system is overwhelmed or blocked, which can lead to flooding and water damage in your basement.

What's happening: When your washing machine drains, it's pushing water faster than your floor drain can handle it. This typically means there's a blockage in your main drain line, the floor drain itself is clogged, or your home's drainage system has capacity issues. The backup could also indicate problems with your main sewer line, especially if you're noticing slow drains elsewhere in your home.

In Ottawa homes, this is particularly concerning during spring thaw or heavy rainfall seasons when municipal systems are already stressed. Many older Ottawa homes have combined floor drains that connect to the main sewer line, making them vulnerable to backups. If left untreated, you risk sewage backup into your basement, which creates health hazards and expensive cleanup costs.

Immediate steps: Stop using your washing machine until this is resolved. Check if other drains in your basement are slow or backing up - this helps determine if it's a localized floor drain issue or a main line problem. Never use chemical drain cleaners on floor drains, as they can damage pipes and won't solve the underlying blockage.

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There's a sewage smell in my basement but no visible backup. What's wrong?

Sewer gas smell without visible backup typically indicates a dry trap, damaged vent, or compromised seal somewhere in your plumbing system. This is a health concern that needs prompt attention, as sewer gases contain harmful compounds like hydrogen sulfide and methane.

The most common culprit is **dry P-traps** in floor drains, utility sinks, or rarely-used fixtures. These U-shaped pipes under drains hold water to block sewer gases from entering your home. If a fixture hasn't been used in weeks or months, the water evaporates and creates a direct path for sewer gas. Run water in all basement drains and sinks for 30 seconds to refill the traps - this often solves the problem immediately.

Damaged or loose wax rings around toilets can also allow sewer gas to escape, especially if the toilet rocks slightly when you sit on it. Similarly, cracked vent pipes, loose cleanout caps, or deteriorated caulking around fixtures can create entry points for gases. In Ottawa's climate, freeze-thaw cycles can worsen these seal failures over time.

Check your sump pump pit if you have one - the cover should be sealed, and the discharge line should have a proper trap. Some homeowners remove sump covers for maintenance and don't reseal them properly, creating another gas entry point.

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My basement is flooding with water right now. What do I do first?

Shut off your main water valve immediately - this is located where the water line enters your home, usually near the front foundation wall or utility room. Turn it clockwise to stop all water flow to your house.

Get to safety first. If there's any electrical equipment, outlets, or appliances in the flooded area, do not enter the water. Turn off electricity to the basement at your main electrical panel if you can do so safely from a dry location. If you smell gas or suspect a gas leak, evacuate immediately and call your gas company.

Once the water is shut off and it's safe to enter, try to identify the source of the flooding. Common causes include burst pipes, water heater failure, sump pump malfunction, or sewer backup. If you see sewage or the water is coming up through floor drains, this is a sewer backup emergency - avoid contact with the water as it contains harmful bacteria.
